## Show progress app demonstration event

Fiona Moody, head of Post-16 at Fosse Way School, has been working on an exciting piece of software with a company called Show Progress, for just over a year. Aimed at special schools, the app captures students' progress in a meaningful way which produces data.

Since developing it, Fosse Way have been involved in both a residential Ofsted inspection and the school was a pilot for the new Ofsted framework and on both occasions Ofsted felt the app captured progress over time and described it as "innovative".

The Show Progress app is aimed at special schools and is:

**Person-centred**—Create individual learning journals online. Staff set specific targets for each pupil or client individually, avoiding the 'tick box' approach.

**Framework-independent**—Targets are drawn from a framework created or compiled by the school—accommodates your own approach to teaching and assessment.

**Evidence-focused**—After setting a pupil's targets, start gathering evidence for each target, including photographs, if you want. The date and time is recorded to demonstrate development over time.

**Fully customisable**—Flexible platform, fully customisable to your school's needs. Set up your own assessment framework and progress levels rather than using a one-size-fits-all solution.

**Sharing enabled**—Parents can view their child's targets and progress online. Staff can generate custom reports to share with parents and other professionals. Read-only access for other users coming soon.

**Secure**—Cutting-edge cloud-based technology. Show Progress is secure, reliable, and responsive.

**Progress Tracking**—Simple and easy to understand, produced in the format of graphs, option to export data to Excel and a range of easy to send home reports available, removing the need to write school reports

Finally and, possibly, one of the most exciting bits, is that Show Progress is cheap, only £12 per student annually.
